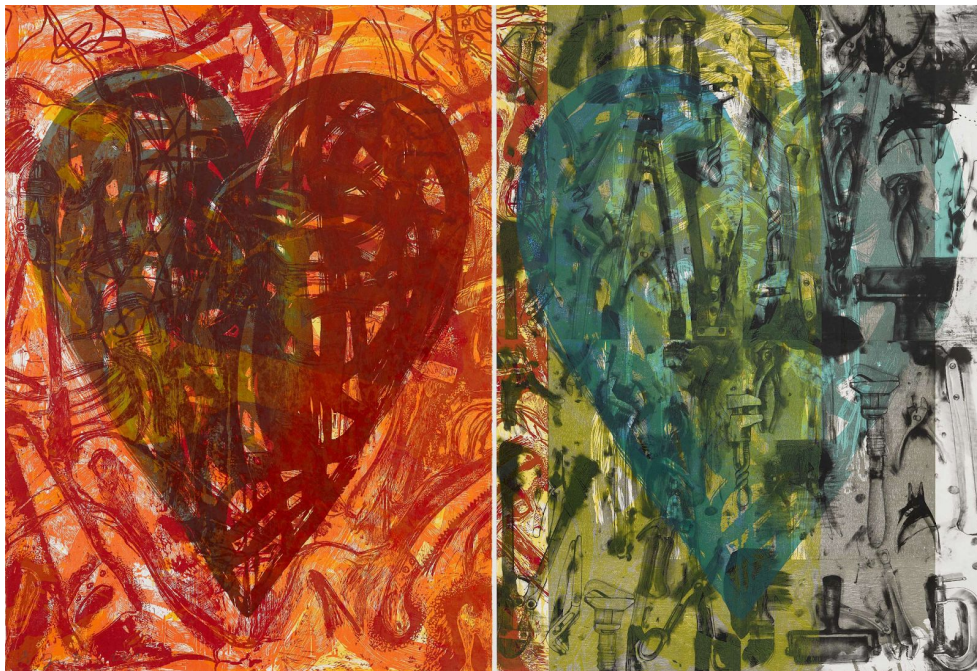

JIM DINE TO DELIVER THE JORDAN SCHNITZER FAMILY FOUNDATION LECTURE AT THE IFPDA PRINT FAIR; MEL BOCHNER AND MATTHEW DAY JACKSON TO RECEIVE JORDAN SCHNITZER AWARDS

New York, September 18, 2019 —

Executive Director of the IFPDA and IFPDA Foundation Jenny Gibbs has announced program highlights for the IFPDA Fine Art Print Fair, to be held at the Javits Center, 421 11th Avenue New York, 23-27 October 2019. “This year we are foregrounding the role of the artist and of the master printer to reveal the special nature of this creative and collaborative process with more than a dozen public programs featuring

artists, curators, scholars, and master printers including **Jim Dine, Mel Bochner, Matthew Day Jackson, Nadine Orenstein, John Yau, and Tony Freund**".

Jim Dine will be presenting the Jordan Schnitzer Family Foundation Lecture on Saturday 26 October. Dine is one of the most significant artists of his generation. His work is in the collection of major museums around the world. Since his first solo exhibition in New York in 1960, his paintings, sculptures, photography, and prints have been the subject of over 300 solo exhibitions worldwide, most recently at the Centre Pompidou, Paris (2018). Dine will be joined in conversation by master printers, Ruth Lingen and Julia Damario

Also on 26 October the 2019 Jordan Schnitzer Awards for Excellence in Printmaking will be presented to **Mel Bochner and Matthew Day Jackson by Jordan Schnitzer**.

A new highlight of this year's Fair will be four curated project spaces including two major site-specific commissions, the details of which will be released next week.

From 12 to 1 pm on Sunday, October 27, visitors can explore the booths and meet artists such as **Jacob Hashimoto, James Nares, Yvonne Jacquette, William Tillyer, and Erik Desmazières** to learn about their inspiration and process.

"I am immensely proud of each of this year's 70 exhibitors from the IFPDA's international membership," says David Tunick, President of the IFPDA. "Together, these eminent galleries are presenting an extraordinary breadth of work throughout art history from Rembrandt to Rauschenberg."
